They present note spelling on the grand staff, leger lines and spaces, chord note spelling, whole steps and half steps, forming tetrachords and major scales and notes and rests in 4/4, 3/4, 2/4, and 6/8 meter.

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Piano Lessons Book 5 (Music Instruction) - Fred Kern 1998-03-01 (Educational Piano Library). In Book 5 , students are introduced to sixteenth notes in various rhythm patterns. The wide variety of student selections include 3 folk, 4 jazz, 13 classical, and 8 contemporary original pieces. Scales (in both 8th and 16th-note patterns) with their cadences are presented in five major and five minor keys. Root, 1st inversion, 2nd

inversion, and open position chords for each key center are also introduced.
